Purpose

The NYU Robert F. Wagner Graduate School of Public Service is honored to offer the Stephen Charney Vladeck Junior Faculty Fellowship. Stephen Charney Vladeck devoted his life to issues of labor, health care, social justice and individual rights. The fellowship is intended to assist selected junior faculty in launching or completing substantial research in social justice, health care, labor law, labor history and/or individual rights. The major emphasis of the research should be on urban problems. While the committee is particularly interested in work focused on New York City, it is not a requirement for consideration.

Each Fellow receives a one-year, non-renewable \$15,000 research stipend. The 2010–2011 Fellow must use the award by December 31, 2011.

Eligibility

Applicants must be full-time, tenure-track faculty members with the rank of assistant professor or above who have completed at least one year and no more than four years of full-time teaching (or its equivalent) at NYU.

A faculty member may submit only one proposal in a given academic year.

Application Criteria & Format

The selection committee will judge applications according to the following criteria:

1. Relationship between the proposal and the Fellowship's thematic emphasis areas
2. Clarity of conceptual definition, sound methodology and a promise of significant contribution to the applicant's field
3. Evidence of strong scholarly potential and commitment to teaching
4. Strength of evaluation letters

Proposal Format

1. Standardized cover sheet
2. Abstract—one page, single-spaced, succinctly describing the project and its objectives
3. Project statement—seven pages or fewer, double-spaced, including:
 - a. Project description
 - b. Project design (methods)
 - c. Project budget
 - d. Description of present state of knowledge in the field and need for the project. Comment on potential contribution to the field.
 - e. Prospects – Where will the project lead?

External Project Evaluations

1. Three experts in the field related to the proposal should review your project and comment on its viability, relevance and potential contributions.
2. NYU faculty, research colleagues, dissertation advisers, personal friends or mentors are not eligible evaluators. The selection committee may solicit additional reviews at its discretion.

Appendix & Attachments

1. Curriculum vitae (including a list of honors, professional associations, papers and publications)
2. Supporting materials, if appropriate (20 pages or fewer)
3. Name of principal research adviser for current research and/or doctoral dissertation adviser and his/her university affiliation
