Please join members of the White House Fellows Foundation and Association at a special recruitment session on the White House Fellows Program. Founded in 1964, the White House Fellows Program is America's most prestigious program for leadership and public service, offering exceptional men and women first-hand experience working at the highest levels of the federal government. White House Fellows typically spend a year working as full-time, paid special assistants to senior White House Staff, the Vice President, Cabinet Secretaries, and other top-ranking government officials. Fellows also participate in an once-in-a-lifetime education program consisting of numerous off-the-record, roundtable discussions with renowned leaders from the private and public sectors throughout the year, and take trips to study leaders and policy in action both domestically and internationally. Fellowships are awarded on a strictly non-partisan basis by the President upon recommendation of the President's Commission on White House Fellowships.

The program has fostered a legacy of leadership, with over 640 alumni who are respected leaders in a variety of fields and professions. Alumni include former Secretary of State Colin Powell, General Wesley Clark, Senator Sam Brownback, Echoing Green President Cheryl Dorsey, former CNN President Tom Johnson, Levi Strauss & Co CEO Robert Haas, former NBC Chairman Jane Pfeiffer, Wall St. Journal Editorial Page Editor Paul Gigot, CNN's Dr. Sanjay Gupta, former Senator Tim Wirth, former National Security Advisor Robert McFarlane, former Secretary of Labor Elaine Chao, former Tenneco CEO Dana Mead, Court of Appeals Judges Deanell Tacha and Margaret McKeown, and author Doris Kearns Goodwin.

Applications must be postmarked by February 1, 2010 for the 2010-11 Class. The program commences in September of each year. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and employees of the Federal government are not eligible unless they are career military personnel. There are no age restrictions; however the program was originally created to give remarkable young Americans this leadership development experience while they were early to mid-career. Applicants must have completed their undergraduate studies and be working in their chosen professions at the time of consideration.
