New Spring Semester Courses

Technology, New Media & Cities

Anthony Townsend will offer a new course, Technology, New Media and Cities. The Internet and mobile communications technologies are altering the spatial fabric of 21st century cities in the US and the world.

This course examines social, economic, and physical implications of new information and communications technologies on urban environments. Topics include: the impact of new technologies on transportation, smart city design, surveillance and urban warfare, the Digital Divide, wireless communications, & the planning process.

Urbanization & Housing in Developing Countries

Professor Shlomo Angel, senior housing policy advisor to the Inter-American Development Bank and the author of *Housing Policy Matters: A Global Analysis* (Oxford University Press, 2000) is teaching Urbanization & Housing in Developing Countries. The course will focus on the economic, social, demographic, and political context of urbanization; understanding and measuring housing and urban living conditions; evaluating urban policies, programs, and projects; and guidelines and prospects for housing and urban development reform.
