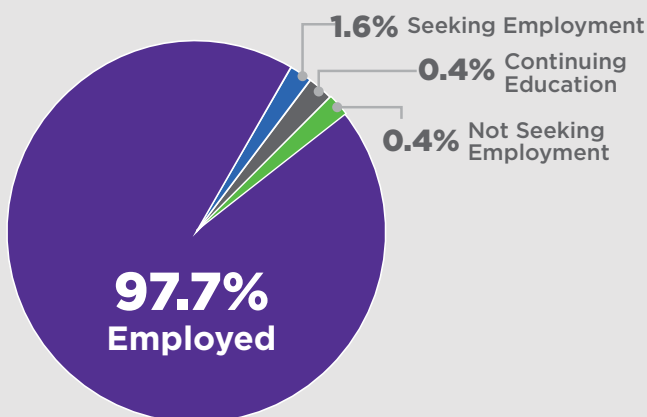


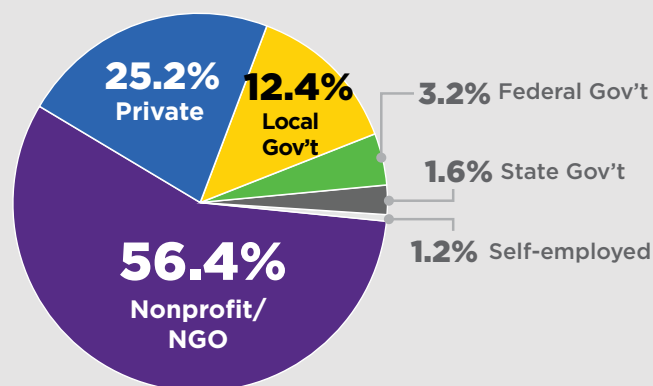
EMPLOYMENT REPORT: 2020 GRADUATES
