ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

The program is completed part-time over two academic years. Students complete 30 credits, consisting of five core courses (12 credits), five electives (15 credits), and a Capstone project (3 credits).

REQUIRED CORE COURSES:

- Introduction to Health Policy and Management
- Continuous Quality Improvement for Healthcare Leaders
- Health Services Management
- Financial Management for Public, Nonprofit, and Health Organizations

ELECTIVE COURSES:

Students work with a faculty advisor to select elective coursework from NYU Wagner and across NYU (including the College of Nursing). Sample elective courses include:

- The Business of Healthcare
- The Realities of Managing Complex Health Systems
- Ethical Issues in Healthcare Management
- Performance Measurement and Management
- Building Effective Teams
- Project Management
