ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

The MPA-PNP program can be completed in two years full-time or three to four years part-time, with flexibility to switch between the two. All students take core courses in management, policy, and finance, then specialize with required courses and a wide range of electives.

SPECIALIZATIONS

Students select a specialization and complete 45 credits to graduate.

ADVOCACY & POLITICAL ACTION

equips you to enhance your impact and drive change in civic engagement, politics, and advocacy. Learn strategies and tactics to effectively mobilize people, organizations, and systems.

INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT POLICY & MANAGEMENT

empowers students for global public service, tackling the challenges of implementing complex public service policies and programs in different international contexts.

PUBLIC POLICY

gives you the analytical and qualitative skills you'll need to evaluate and create policy that better serves the public good.

FINANCE

prepares you for a finance career in the nonprofit, public, or private sector. You'll study the field of finance from both an internal managerial perspective (financial management) and an external policy perspective (public finance).

blends financial management, impact investment, operations, and policy to prepare you to develop entrepreneurial solutions to the world's most pressing challenges.

APPLICATION COMPONENTS

- US bachelor's degree or equivalent
- Online application
- Essays
- Transcripts

- Two letters of recommendation

Additional Requirements for International Applicants:

- Proof of English Language Proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS, or Duolingo scores) is required if the bachelor's degree was not conducted in English
- International Credential Evaluation is required for applicants who earned their degree outside of the US or Canada

CAPSTONE (3 CREDITS)

The Capstone Program, an essential component for all MPA students, involves a year-long consulting or research project.
