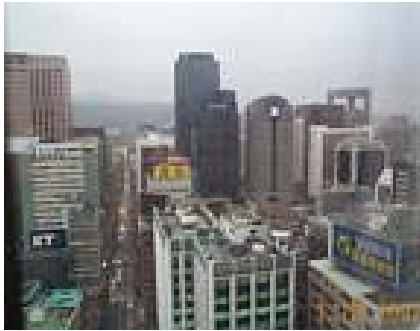

Anthony is working with experts from MIT and the Seoul Development Institute on business and marketing strategy development for Seoul Digital Media City.

Students Work on Lower Manhattan Research Project

Craig Whitaker, NYU Adjunct Planning Professor, is directing an independent research project dealing with the future development of Lower Manhattan. Twelve NYU Urban Planning students and two students from the New Jersey Institute of Technology are participating in this endeavor.

The project will explore stakeholders' interests and balance aesthetic quality, financial vested interest, residential concerns, and political impacts. The group is interviewing key leaders and organizations in lower Manhattan.

The project team will examine transportation systems, including the subways and PATH trains, a proposed underground pedestrian concourse linking the two and the potential for ferry service. They will also explore linking Battery Park City with the rest of Lower Manhattan.
