

NEW COURSES IN FALL 2002

Georges Jacquemart to teach "Urban Transportation Planning"

Georges Jacquemart, a principal of Buckhurst Fish and Jacquemart, Inc., will teach P11.2641, "Urban Transportation Planning" in fall 2002. This course will emphasize the interplay between transportation planning theory & methodology, and the practical application of planning in a public environment. It will examine traditional and contemporary theory in transportation planning; the legal, regulatory and institutional framework for planning; transportation planning for public agencies; and financing transportation plans.

Independent Research in Planning Capstone Seminar: "The Effects of September 11th on the New York Metropolitan Region"

Mitchell Moss will teach a two-semester research seminar to explore the economic, social, political and environmental effects of the September 11th attack.

Leading experts will participate in this seminar. Topics will include: economic development patterns in NY and other large regions; the role of public and nonprofit agencies in providing assistance; the impact on the energy and telecommunications infrastructure of NYC; the response of fire, police and emergency service workers; the long-term effects on tourism and air travel; the planning and political processes for rebuilding lower Manhattan; and the impact on office location patterns in NY and other cities.

"International Development Project Planning"

Adjunct Professor Leonardo Romeo will teach a new course, International Development Project Planning (P11.2652). This course will focus on the challenges facing project planners in governments and aid agencies.
