P11.2635(001) Special Topics in Urban Planning: Building Community Wealth

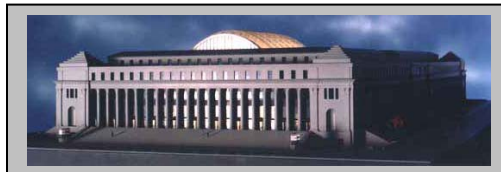
